# The View From Under the Umbrella of Fanlasy

## DEFINITIONS OF SUB-GENRE

- **Fantasy:** Fiction that commonly uses magic and other supernatural phenomena as a primary element of plot, theme, or setting. The stories take place in imaginary worlds where magic is common.
- High Fantasy: Hero's Quest or Epic Fantasy. Dragons and Knights-in-shining-armor usually abound.
- **Paranormal:** Deals with fantastical creatures or situations that give you creepy crawly feelings on your skin. i.e., vampires, werewolves, zombies, ghosts, angels, demons.
- **Dystopian:** An alternate timeline or future in which modern day society has crumbled and is in a repressive and controlled state, often under the guise of being a utopian. Dystopian societies are often imagined as police states with unlimited power over the citizens.
- Science Fiction: A genre of fiction dealing with imaginary but more or less plausible content such as future settings, futuristic science and technology, space travel, aliens, and paranormal abilities. Exploring the consequences of scientific innovations is one purpose of science fiction.
- **Urban Fantasy (or gothic fantasy):** describes a work that is set primarily in a city and contains aspects of fantasy. These matters may involve the arrivals of alien races, the discovery of earthbound mythological creatures, coexistence between humans and paranormal beings, conflicts between humans and malicious paranormals.
- Myth: A traditional or legendary story, usually concerning some being or hero or event, with or without a natural explanation, especially one that is concerned with deities or demigods and explains some practice, rite, or phenomenon of nature.
- Legends & Fables: These terms usually refer to stories that are handed down by tradition. Legend denotes a story (sometimes involving the supernatural) usually concerned with a real person, place, or object, as in the legend of the Holy Grail. A fable is specifically a story (often with animals or inanimate things as speakers or actors) designed to teach a moral.
- Steampunk incorporates elements of science fiction, fantasy, alternate history, and speculative fiction. Steam power is widely used in an alternate history such as Victorian era Britain, Wild West America, or a post-apocalyptic time —that incorporates elements of science fiction or fantasy. Steampunk features anachronistic technology based on a Victorian perspective.
- **Magical Realism:** A style of fiction which firmly takes place within the regular world in which magical elements blend with the real world. The story explains these magical elements as real occurrences, presented in a straightforward manner that places the "real" and the "fantastic" as the same.
- Fairy Tales: A type of story that features folkloric fantasy characters, such as fairies, goblins, elves, trolls, dwarves, giants, mermaids or gnomes, and usually magic or enchantments.
